The Epiphany is a meaningful feast following Christmas when Jesus came into the world for us. Some magi, a generic word used for the wise persons, priests, magicians, sorcerers, soothsayers or astrologers who were advisers to the kings of the Persians and Medes, also found their way to Bethlehem to pay homage to the newborn King of Israel.

These men were not Jews, but foreigners. They likely had read and discussed the Messianic prophecies and were anxious to see when this Messianic King would appear. God led them by means of an extraordinary star across the desert to the little town of Bethlehem where Jesus was born. In their thirst for knowledge of God, the wise men from the East willingly left everything, their home and country, in pursuit of that quest. In their diligent search, they were led to the source of true knowledge, that is Jesus Christ, the Light and Wisdom of God. The light of a star guided them to the true Light. When they found the newborn King they humbly worshiped Him and gave Him gifts fitting for a king.

This feast extends the family of all human beings, of all nations, and invites them to be illumined. The Lord of the universe who revealed the star of Bethlehem to the Gentiles of the East so they could come and worship Jesus, the Prince of Peace (Isaiah 9:6) and King of Kings (Revelations 19:16), gives each one of us the same light of revelation to recognize and accept Jesus as our Lord and Savior.

The feast of the Epiphany in this light is both a call and a challenge for us. The important message is that the magi did not give up. We, too, must have that longing to search for the true light for our lives. May this New Year 2025 bring you a load of blessings and light to shine in this world. Amen. Fr. Robin Bashir




