This Sunday, we are celebrating the Solemnity of the Most Holy Body and Blood of Christ. It is a feast to strengthen our faith in Jesus' true presence in the Eucharist, a presence which feeds and nourishes us. It is a presence that reminds us that He is with us and loves us. It is the most beautiful experience of meeting with Him in the sacrament of the Eucharist. We hear the Gospel about the multiplication of the loaves. Jesus' feeding of the five thousand is the only miracle recorded in all four Gospels. This miracle has a great significance, and feeding of such a great multitude pointed to God's provision of manna (bread) in the wilderness for the people of Israel under Moses' leadership. Jesus' feeding of the five thousand is a sign of God's generous care and provision for His people. When God gives, He gives abundantly. He gives more than we need for ourselves so that we may have something to share with others, especially those in need. God takes the little we have and multiplies it for the good of others. When we receive from the Lord's table, we unite ourselves to Jesus Christ, who makes us sharers in His body and blood. St. Ignatius of Antioch (35-107 A.D.) calls it the "one bread that provides the medicine of immortality, the antidote for death, and the food that makes us live forever in Jesus Christ." This supernatural food is healing for both body and soul and strength for our journey heavenward. Often, when we approach the Table of the Lord, we expect to receive healing, pardon, comfort, and rest for our souls, but the Lord has much more for us, more than we can ask or imagine. The principal fruit of receiving the Eucharist is an intimate union with Christ. As bodily nourishment restores lost strength, so the Eucharist strengthens us in charity and enables us to break with disordered attachments to creatures, and to be more firmly rooted in the love of Christ. We need to trust in God's provision and to share freely with others, especially those who lack what they need. Let us continue loving the Holy Eucharist deeply and break ourselves for others.
