After Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist at the River Jordan, the Holy Spirit led Him, and He withdrew into the wilderness of Judea. It was a vast and mostly uninhabitable wilderness full of danger: danger from scorching heat by day and extreme cold at night; danger from wild animals and scorpions; plus, the deprivation of food and the scarcity of water. Jesus went to the wilderness to prepare Himself for the mission, which the heavenly Father had entrusted to Him. Jesus did not eat or meet with anyone during these days. Luke tells us that at the end of Jesus' forty days in the wilderness, one visitor came out to tempt Him. Luke describes this tempter as the devil, who is also called the father of lies. He is the same deceiver who tempted Adam and Eve in the Garden of Paradise. Satan saw an opportunity to strike while Jesus appeared more vulnerable in His physically and emotionally weakened condition, due to His prolonged fasting and inner struggle over His particular call and mission. Satan undoubtedly thought that he could persuade Jesus to choose a wrong path, but Jesus remained humble and obedient to his Father's will.

Like Jesus, we are also tempted many times, but Jesus teaches us how we can respond in our time of trials. Jesus teaches us to wrestle with Satan. When we are connected with God the Father, Satan can do nothing to us. The Holy Mother Church guides us to pray, do penance, and share with others. These three things are the weapons to fight against Satan, when he pulls us to a rebellious direction or tries to trap us by attracting us towards material things: world's glory, wealth, and power.

We need to be generous towards others in praying for them, avoid wasting God's gifts, and fast from resentment or bitterness. Before making a judgment, we should recall how Jesus overlooks our faults.

Let us move into this season of Lent whole heartedly, with the right relationship with God and our neighbor, and continue preparing ourselves by fasting, prayer and charity for the great feast of His Resurrection.


